

Japanese delegation meets PM

Online Desk : A delegation from Mitsui & Co, one of Japan's largest trading and investment companies, paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister Tarique Rahman on Wednesday. The meeting was held at the Prime Minister's Office in the Cabinet Division at Bangladesh Secretariat. Mitsui & Co operates globally across sectors including logistics, infrastructure, metals, energy and food trade. During the meeting, discussions were held on potential investment opportunities and expansion in sectors such as food, agriculture, energy and ICT.
