

Foreign secretary highlights Bangladesh's extraordinary socio-economic success

Referring to Bangabandhu's famous foreign policy dictum “Friendship to all and malice towards none”, he further said that we are deeply engaged to advance the mandate of the UN on many important issues including migration, climate change, women empowerment and international peace and security.

The event was attended by more than 100 Permanent Representatives, high officials of the UN Secretariat, international media personalities, think tank and other dignitaries. The event started with hoisting of national flag and playing the national anthem. The guests were served iftar-dinner with traditional Bangladeshi cuisine.
